Livia Velicu

Livia is a charity lawyer at Bates Wells, a charity specialist law firm.

Greyham Dawes

Greyham Dawes, FCA, DChA, is a retired Chartered Accountant with a specialism in advising on all aspects of regulatory compliance by UK charities, as well as on their restructuring and their public accountability. He was ACAT's treasurer for some ten years, but stood down at the 2021 AGM, having served the maximum number of consecutive terms in office under the Constitution. Since then, he has stayed on as a specialist adviser to the Board, until co-opted as a director earlier this month. He is now standing for nomination by the membership for a new term in office, as allowed under the Constitution.

Prior to his retirement from full-time employment in London in August 2018, Greyham had served for many years on the managing committee of the "Charities & Voluntary Sector Special Interest Group" of the Institute of Chartered Accountants in England & Wales, and had been an independent member of the Audit Committee at SCOPE and a trustee of two registered charities:
